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Report on "The Nutcracker" 2019

16 months of planning and preparation, 137 performers, over 70 volunteers behind the scenes, 5 sold out performances at Theatr Brycheiniog which received a rapturous reception and some wonderful reviews and feedback. All in all, The Nutcracker 2019 can be considered a success!

From the moment the project was announced in September 2018 on Facebook, offers of help came flooding in. It seemed that local people were willing to contribute their time and skills towards Brecon's own (and first) Christmas ballet. Katy Sinnadurai (artistic director) and Lesley Walker (company secretary) set about forming Brecon Festival Ballet Ltd, a not-for-profit company, so that donations could be received and publicity material begin to be generated. (Please note that BFB plans to become a charity in 2020, but a decision was made not to pursue this path in 2019, given the limited time available to mount the production.)

The volunteers were organised into groups, headed by incredibly skilled local artists, such as Rachel Giaccone, who designed some wonderful costumes on a shoestring budget. Rachel gave out materials and instructions to her team of seamstresses, and slowly the rats, soldiers, Georgian folk dresses and sparkly Snowflake costumes came to life. Brecon based young artist, Gemma Schiebe, came up with a colourful and inventive design for the "Kingdom of Sweets" backcloth. It had been over a decade since a cloth was last painted in the Theatr Brycheiniog workshop, but with the help of the theatre staff and the Westenders pantomime society, a full-size paint frame was built and a blank canvas purchased and stretched onto it to begin the work. Over many months, Gemma spent her evenings after work painting this backcloth, it was wonderful to see the process and this was a great achievement for a young artist that had never before painted something on this scale.

Other local skilled craftsmen and women made detailed and beautiful props, including cavalry horses, wooden guns and swords for the battle scene, a sleigh, an eight-foot-high clock, a mini theatre and a growing Christmas tree for the magical transformation scene! And many other volunteers gave generously of their time and ideas to help our fundraising campaign.

The total cost of putting on this huge and ambitious production was actually around one hundred thousand pounds. However, around £60,000 of this total was given for free, including accommodation for all the professional and student dancers (including at the Gremlin pub, 6 Bridge Street Air B&B and Cantref bunkhouse), free studio time and stage time in production week from our co-producers, Theatr Brycheiniog, over many months of rehearsals, the time of the 2 directors, Katy and Lesley, the prop makers, artists, other dance

teachers, chaperones, Welsh translator, programme and website designers and the choir mistress. Without these "in kind" donations, the project could not have been realised. The remaining £40,000 that BFB needed to raise was to pay for the Welsh Chamber Orchestra, the 10 professional dancers and the cost of materials for props and scenery, plus hire costs for additional costumes and scenery that could not be sourced or made in Brecon this time. Money also needed to be found for marketing and publicity, insurance, website costs and other sundries.

A fund-raising campaign was launched in February 2019, with the aim of raising this £40,000. We hosted many events such as open dance classes, a "Zumbathon", raffles, bucket collections, bag packing in Morrisons in Brecon and a "Friends of Brecon festival Ballet" membership scheme. Many generous individuals joined the Friends, keen to get a glimpse "behind the scenes" at rehearsals. Others donated online to our JustGiving page. Lesley and Katy also spent a huge amount of time applying for grants from various grant giving bodies. It was the local organisations that responded most positively, with generous grants given by Brecon Town Council, Brecon Rotary Club, Gibbs Trust, Audrey Tyler trust fund, Brecknock Art Trust, The Arts Society, Brecknock, and a significant grant of £10,000 from the Brecon Beacons National Park Authority's Sustainable Development Fund. Brecon Town Council also got behind the project by announcing that their annual Christmas shop window dressing competition would be on the theme of the Nutcracker! Many shops got into the spirit and Brecon's shop windows were full of Nutcracker themed decorations. This really got the town talking about the production and by mid-November tickets were almost sold out. In order that local people shouldn't miss out on tickets, the dress rehearsal was also opened to the public, with the added benefit that the less experienced onstage performers would get used to an audience before the opening night.

Rehearsals were gathering pace, the trickiest part being bringing together all the diverse elements of the ballet in one single production week running up to opening night, which was, of course, a world premiere! This ballet was a "first" in several ways:

It was the first time a full-scale classical production of The Nutcracker had been created in Wales. It was the first time that Welsh Chamber Orchestra had ever played for a ballet company. It was the first time that Theatr Brycheiniog had ever presented a classical ballet with a live orchestra. And, as respected dance critic, Deborah Weiss wrote: it was "almost certainly the first ballet of its kind to involve an entire community"

Although based on the traditional Nutcracker scenario that audiences know and love (and flock to every year all over the world), the choreography for this production was almost entirely original, created by artistic director Katy Sinnadurai. Having been a professional ballet dancer herself, with experience of dancing in this iconic ballet, Katy combined her past onstage experience with her own vision of the story to create this new production for Brecon. Thanks to the offer of studio space at Theatr Brycheiniog, Katy spent many Sundays throughout 2019 alone in the studio, trying out choreography and slowly piecing together the steps for the 99 dancers and actors. Katy decided to create a version of the ballet that would focus on the love story between Clara and her Nutcracker, who becomes a young man once the spell that trapped him within a Nutcracker doll has been broken. Katy felt that by focussing on the human story within the ballet, the audience would be more likely to understand the ballet and relate to it. Feedback received from the performances indicated that audience members did understand the story; they were seen cheering and laughing during the course

of the evening, and many told us that they shed an emotional tear. Theatr Brycheiniog staff reported audiences coming out of the auditorium after Act 1 and 2 full of excitement and praise. They said there was a real buzz in the building! We received 2 excellent reviews, one in the Brecon and Radnor Express and one on the website of the International "Dance for You" magazine. A link to this latter review, together with some of the feedback received can be found at the end of this report.

One of the aspects of Brecon Festival Ballet's Nutcracker production that we are most proud of, is the number of Wales-based participants. Many children in Brecon learn to dance, mostly with Mid Wales Dance Academy (which is based at Theatr Brycheiniog). But those talented few that go on from Brecon to be professional dancers only have very rare opportunities to perform in their home country. Of the 99 onstage performers in Nutcracker, 82 were Welsh or connected to Wales by training or employment. Most of the orchestral musicians and choir singers were from South and Mid Wales. And so, overall, we gave the opportunity to perform in a large-scale classical ballet to well over 100 Welsh people in our small town... a great achievement.

The production was of a high professional standard, even though the majority of onstage performers were students or amateurs, a few of whom had never set foot on a stage before! Collaboration was our key word here. By combining the professional with the local, aspiration levels were raised, children and students were inspired to raise their game to professional level. In future years, we hope that some of our principal dancers will have started their journey as a small child playing the role of a rat or a party guest in the Nutcracker! We know that the local community loves to come and support local talent on their journey.

Despite there being so many different groups of people that made up the Brecon Festival Ballet company of 2019 — dancers, musicians, actors, singers, stage crew, prop makers, costume makers and artists, old and young, professional and amateur — there was a lovely family atmosphere onstage and backstage. A feeling of all pulling together to create something special.

We are delighted to have been invited back to Theatr Brycheiniog in December 2020 for more Nutcracker performances and we look forward to bringing all these people together once more, with some new additions to the cast and crew no doubt, to create the magic all over again.
